Jeffery Robichaud is the Director of EPA Region 7's Water Division. Jeff spent three years with an environmental consulting firm, before joining EPA in 1998 as an engineer leading the development of two National Primary Drinking Water Regulations in EPA's Office of Ground Water and Drinking Water in D.C. In 2001, he moved to Kansas City where he served in a variety of leadership roles including Senior Policy Advisor to the Regional Administrator, Chief of the Environmental Assessment and Monitoring Branch, Deputy Director of the Environmental Sciences and Technology Division, Acting Assistant Regional Administrator, Acting Land Chemical and Redevelopment Director, and Director of the Water, Wetlands, and Pesticides Division. He is the recipient of numerous awards from the Agency, as well as the 2017 Partnership for Public Service Samuel Heyman Service to America Medal as part of the Urban Waters Federal Partnership Team.

Jeff hails from Redmond, WA and earned his Bachelor of Science in Environmental Systems Engineering from the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia and his Master of Science in Engineering Management from the University of Kansas, where he taught for several years and where he serves as a founding member of KU's Environmental Industry Board.
